








Inbound Visitors to the Philippines, 2012








Inbound visitors from Asia Pacific, 2012












Philippines: A Dive Destination

















Anilao, Batangas

®Not only ideal for poking around and observing marine life but also outstanding for macro photography.



Multi-hued crinoids are prolific. Variety of nudibranchs is unmatched.



ONight dives are especially nice and often reveal unusual creatures like sea hares, sea goblins, catfish eels, ghost pipe fishes, blueringed octopuses, mandarin fishes, and snake eels.









®World-famous for splendid beaches, coral reefs, and exquisite dive sites for new and experienced divers.



10 Has shallow coral gardens, interesting rock formations, and colourful species to watch, like crabs, shrimps, sea anemones, moray, and trumpet fishes.









Tubbataha Reef National Park, Palawan

©Home to some of the most beautiful coral reefs in the world.



©Rising from the volcanic depths of the Sulu Sea, these magnificent atolls encompass an astonishing diversity of marine life.



©Only marine natural park listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.







Apo Island, Negros Oriental

©One of the smallest volcanic islands that is best known for its marine sanctuaries.



®Beneath the clear sparkling blue waters of the island lies a breathtaking collection of over 600 documented fish species and 400 varieties of corals.









Malapascua Island, Cebu

©Known for its wide white sand and bounty beach.



©Has beautiful coral gardens and excellent dive spots nearby, including Monad Shoal, an underwater plateau where thresher sharks and manta rays can be sighted on a regular basis.



©Only place in the world where divers can reliably sight thresher sharks.







Cabilao and Balicasag, Bohol

©Cabilao has wonderful and undisturbed reefs, the peaceful atmosphere, and famous shoals of hammerhead sharks.



©Balicasag Island is home to some 400 meters of successfully protected marine sanctuary.
